NHS Primary Care Staff Respect Materials

The 2020 NHS Staff Survey for England found that 14.5% of all staff responding experienced at least one incident of physical violence in the last 12 months.

Recent external surveys suggest that abuse of GP practice staff from patients is rising, and abuse and violence has been widely cited as a contributing factor to reduced morale amongst GP practice and other NHS staff.

Apprenticeships

An Apprenticeship is on-the-job training that leads to national and international recognised qualifications ranging from Level 2 (GCSE-equivalent) to Level 7 (Masters-equivalent) and open to ages 16 and over.



Apprenticeships in Primary Care broaden the scope of training and developing for existing staff, whilst attracting new members of staff to improve diversity and bridging gaps in the workforce. They provide a future pipeline for clinical and non-clinical roles, simplify career progression, counteract an ageing workforce and provide a life blood to Primary Care workforce. Apprenticeship qualifications are available in a wide range of areas and levels in the Health and Social Care sectors including nursing, healthcare support, business administration, advanced clinical practitioner, team leading, HR, IT just to name a few.

Advanced Clinical Practitioner Level 7 (integrated Degree)

Advanced Clinical Practitioners (ACP's) are experienced clinicians who demonstrate expertise in their scope of practice. ACP's manage defined episodes of clinical care independently, from beginning to end, providing care and treatment from the time an individual first presents through to the end of the episode, which may include admission, referral or discharge or care at home.



Becoming a Primary Care Supervisor and the PG Cert

Pathways: Clinical Supervisor / CS-GPST Supervisor / Educational Supervisor / Roadmap Supervisor

Primary care educators are a crucial part of the general practice workforce and support many groups of learners in their education and development.

- <u>Clinical supervisors</u> (CS) oversee the clinical activity of trainee doctors, ensuring that they only
 perform tasks they are competent to do. To become a Clinical Supervisor for Foundation Year two
 students (FY2), individuals must complete a one day online course.
- The <u>CS-GPST Supervisor</u> course is for accredited clinical supervisors who work in a HEE KSS approved Clinical Supervisor practice only, who are not able to commit to becoming an Educational Supervisor but wish to supervise GP specialty trainees (ST1/2).
- Being a <u>GP Trainer/Educational Supervisor</u> (ES) is an enormous privilege and challenge. It
 means accepting personal responsibility for the development of a Doctor aspiring to be a good
 General Practitioner.
- Roadmap to Practice Supervisor: In support of the Additional Roles Reimbursement Scheme
 (ARRS), allied health professionals (AHP) who want to follow the HEE Roadmaps to Practice,
 and work within primary care, will need a nationally approved supervisor.
