
KENT & MEDWAY TRAINING HUBS

SUPPORTING PLACE BASED LEARNING FOR PARAMEDICS

The Workforce Leads have focused on increasing the increasing the capacity of pre reg paramedic placements since a pilot conducted in collaboration with Canterbury Christ Church University. Direct entry Pre Reg Paramedic Placements, for those undertaking the BSc (Hons) Paramedic Science degree as a route to registration with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) as a Paramedic, are now considered the norm within Primary Care. Indeed placement opportunities have increased to include those students employed within the local Ambulance Service.

Since 2017 this has resulted in 114 placements across Kent and Medway.

TRAINEE ADVANCED CLINICAL CTITIONER(PARAMEDIC) CASE STUDY

Graeme Fletcher did not take part in the pilot but did take a leap of faith into joining Primary Care. Graeme has used this opportunity to further develop and has been supported to enrol on the MSc Advanced Clinical Practitioner Programme and is currently undertaking his third module which focuses on Leadership and innovation. Graeme would recommend Primary Care to any Student and Paramedic considering a future role in Primary Care.
